Allen Glazner is Kenan Distinguished Professor Emeritus at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. His research is focused in California, particularly the Sierra Nevada, where he works on how granite forms and how it is emplaced in the crust. A native of southern California, he obtained geology degrees from Pomona College and UCLA. In addition to his research in the Sierra Nevada, he has authored five *Geology Underfoot* books for the public about eastern and southern California, including the just-released *Geology Underfoot in Death Valley and Eastern California*. He loves leading field trips there.
